

Partnership for Prescription Assistance (PPA):

A guide to patient assistance programs

America's pharmaceutical research companies created the Partnership for Prescription Assistance to help connect lower income people, who are uninsured or underinsured, with patient assistance programs that may be right for them.

- PPA offers a single point of access to more than 475 public and private patient assistance programs, including more than 180 offered by pharmaceutical companies
- For patients without access to a physician, the PPA provides a list of free healthcare providers and clinics available in their community.
- Patients can call a toll-free number (1-888-4PPA-NOW) or log onto a user-friendly website (PPARx.org) to learn more about programs for which they may qualify.
- Many patient assistance programs offer medicines for free or nearly free
